

FOSTER GARDEN

Built in 1999/2000, the Foster garden was created around an existing cherry tree (*Prunus Kanzan*) in the center of the garden. In one just single and bold gesture Roberto Silva designed the garden using a slate wall that frames and undulates the entire space. The result is a garden with three different areas: A path made of self-binding gravel and patio under the tree, the lawn and the round decking on the far end of the garden where the owners entertain their friends and clients. It is a dynamic garden in which the cherry tree creates different moods throughout the seasons dropping its pink petals and golden leaves on the abstract shapes of the garden.

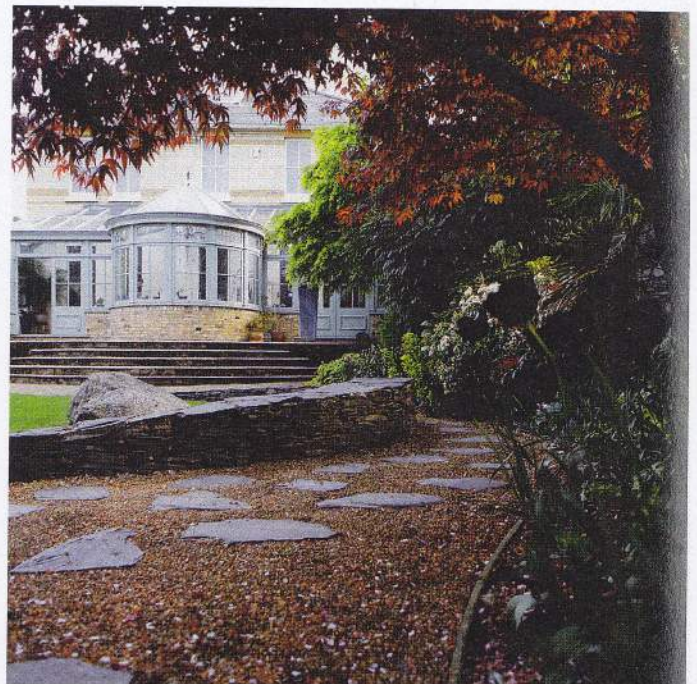
01 Bed with a wide choice of plants 02 View from above with the cherry tree in its mid 03 View towards the house

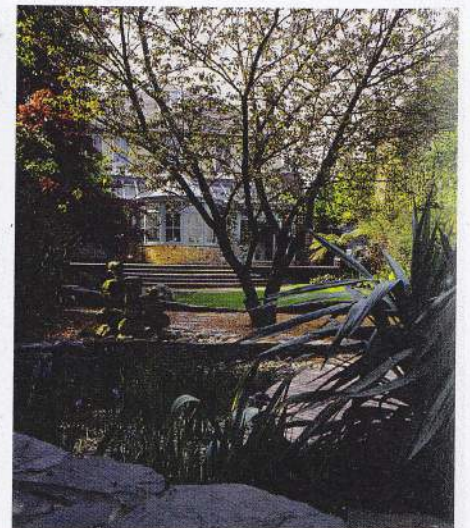
